About M2Z Networks:

Today, well over 100 million Americans lack broadband Internet access. M2Z Networks is a private sector solution to America's broadband divide. M2Z will build a nationwide, free, wireless, broadband Internet network.

What will M2Z do?

In seeking a license to use currently fallow spectrum in the 2155-2175 band, M2Z Networks has made extraordinary public service commitments including:

- Provide a nationwide wireless broadband service free to consumers (supported by geo-tagged ads)
- Block access to indecent content for all users of the free service
- Build a network that would reach 33% of Americans within three years, 66% within five years, and 95% within 10 years
- Provide public safety officials with access to an interoperable secondary data network
- Offer premium (faster & unfiltered) subscription services and pay the U.S. government 5% of gross revenues

M2Z's Application Timeline:

- *May 5, 2006:* M2Z Applies for License with the FCC
- *September 1, 2006:* M2Z's Forbearance Petition
- *January 31, 2007:* FCC seeks public comment on M2Z Application
- *April 3, 2007:* Formal record for Application and Forbearance Petition closes
- *May 5, 2007:* FCC fails to comply with deadline to determine public interest on M2Z application.
- *August 31, 2007:* FCC dismisses M2Z application (without prejudice) and announces intent to begin rulemaking for 2155-2175 spectrum band.
- *Today:* Over 3,000 comments supporting M2Z submitted into the public record

Benefits to the Public of M2Z:

- Free broadband access to at least 95% of Americans regardless of income
- \$18-\$32.4 billion in consumer savings (based on 2 unrefuted economic studies)
- 5% yearly royalty payment to the Treasury for term of license (15 years)
- Child safe (filtered) Internet access
- Broadband access for first responders
